

# 10-12 The Square

## Listed Grade II

*Houses, now one office. C16, early C19, C20. Roughcast walls, upper floor of No 10 tile-hung. Tile roof, with gable to front of No 10, three gabled half-dormers to No 12. Late-medieval timber-framed hall (10) with two-storeyed jettied cross-wing (10), masked by later features. West front of one storey and attic, two storeys, 3.0 windows. Casements.*

Situated virtually in the middle of the main London to Portsmouth Road, later to become the A3, the property dates from the 1500's and belonged to Mr Windibank who also owned the Forge next door.

A small section of the ground floor of Number 10 was converted for shop use and occupied by E Gane Inge Chemist and Photographics, producing amongst other things, postcard views of the village. Later photos show the end of the building converted to a shop on the ground floor extending the chemist round the corner and occupied by Smorthwaite amongst others up to the present day.
