## **Covers Farmhouse, Church Lane, Bramshott**



There is speculation that the oldest part of the house was quite small and could have been of timber and thatch, as the steeply-pitched roof suggests.

On balance, Laurence Giles concludes that Covers was built by John Boxall's father before 1567 There is a tale that after jumping down a well in the house a very troubled young girl became 'the white Lady of Covers' in local ghost stories.

## Listed Grade II

House. Early c19. Ashlar sandstone walls, thin 1st floor band, lintels with carved keys. Tile roof. Symmetrical east front of two storeys, 2 windows. Casements. Arched doorway with fanlight, in a gabled stone porch. Rear Extension 2017 [not part of list description—date is pre-2017
