A "LOCAL LIST"?

This is something being discussed by the Heritage working party of the Neighbourhood Plan group: the working party has 'strong' Preservation Society membership and is chaired by Roger Miller (coincidentally pictured, right, with the broom): planning authorities can decide to 'adopt' a list of un-Listed buildings (and other structures) which, although not given the status or protection afforded to those on the national List, will trigger a higher level of scrutiny if changes are proposed for them. The Society would like to hear suggestions from its Members for possible candidates for such a list. In a similar vein, there are trees, or groups of trees (or even important hedgerows) that may not have met Tree Preservation Order criteria, but are nonetheless important elements in the local landscape ... or have just not yet come forward for adding to the list of TPOs. Again, any ideas?
