Current Concerns

The Society has been concerned about the state of the cobbles and tarmac at the top of Longmoor Road where it enters The Square. Tree roots have caused lifting of the surface, creating a significant trip hazard.

Our chairman has written to the Parish Council highlighting the problem, and Hampshire Highways have put forward a preferred "improvement" scheme which involves removing all the cobbled area and resurfacing with tarmac and a large area of "tiger mulch" (rubberized bark).

The Conservation Team at EHDC are keen to see more sympathetic scheme, reflecting the fact it is in the centre of the Conservation area we have therefore put forward a compromise solution which would retain some cobbled area but include the tiger mulch around the base of the trees. This should make the area safer for pedestrians and lessen the likelihood of root "heave" in the future. The bench will also be replaced when the nature of the scheme is approved.

Hampshire Highways have subsequently addressed the footpath by removing the old tarmac (not shown in picture below), levelling the ground and resurfacing with new tarmac. Nothing has been done to address the cobbles that make up the bulk of the area. We will continue to press for a solution.
